The CMS and AEWA Secretariats are cooperating with the Secretariat of the Conservation of Arctic Flora and Fauna (CAFF) in the development of an Arctic Species Trend Index – Arctic Breeding Migratory Bird Analysis with the aim of utilizing existing data on population trends to show patterns of decline to identify which regions, taxa and habitats are at most imminent threat e.g., from climate change.

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<b>Translation of CMS Website</b> - Activity 4.1:  Produce CMS website in three languages.	17,500		The CMS Family website is under development. The Secretariat is currently reviewing existing web content to be translated for the new site. Some funds for the initial translation work are allocated in the core budget (£8,000 per year, in line 1203). An estimate of further web texts translation and related funding needs will be made once the new site is completed.
<b>Translation of guidance documents</b> - Activity 4.4:  Parties/Signatories to begin to translate guidance documents into local languages to assist implementation.	10,000		This activity is aimed at Governments rather than the Secretariat. However, whenever feasible, the Secretariat has provided translations of documents into additional languages, such as Russian and Arabic and making these available to Parties and Signatories via the website.

Entering into new coordination arrangements for those MoUs that do not currently have them not only requires sufficient and sustainable funding but also the identification of suitable partners.  The Secretariat has however made significant progress in mobilizing resources in support of regional conservation efforts. For instance cooperation with the GIZ Regional Programme for Central Asia has been formalized to support the implementation of CMS activities and instruments in the region.
Implementation Monitoring- Activity 12.5:  Create criteria against which to assess proposed potential new agreements.  Improve identification of priority objectives and prioritize current activities and develop a policy where monitoring implementation must be a part of any future MOUs. CMS provides centralized services relating to build capacity with the CMS Family including training and educational activities.	105,000	sought for capacity building work on more programmatic issues and to address specific	The Secretariat received a significant grant from the EC to support capacity building efforts within the CMS Family. In the context of the project, a manual to assist National Focal Points (NFPs) in their roles and responsibilities was developed. Complementary training sessions and other workshops are planned for African NFPs.  Similar training workshops are planned to be held in the Pacific and Caribbean regions with a contribution from the project Capacity Building Related to Multilateral Environmental Agreements in ACP Countries—Phase 2.  Furthermore, progress is being made to increase the the capacity of customs officers and fisheries officials regarding the implementation of CMS and the Sharks MoU.

However thereafter funds will be needed to continue that position beyond 2014 (estimate of €100,000 per year).
Development of a new CMS Website	97,500	c.a. 75,000	These voluntary contributions matched funds allocated in the core budget (€10,000 per year, in line 2203). The project is about to be completed. No additional funding is needed.
Development of the online reporting system (ORS) including an associated analytical tool	75,000	No funds are planned to be sought independently for the analytical tool	Efforts were made in 2012 to raise funds for the improvement of the existing ORS and development of an analytical tool. No funds have been obtained so far.  Some funds allocated in the core budget (in total €24,000€ per year, in line 1205), were used to produce templates in the ORS for the reporting cycle ending at COP11. In the meantime, the CMS and AEWA Secretariats started a dialogue, in the context of the BLG, to explore the possibility of upgrading the ORS to accommodate needs of other MEAs and create an associated analytical tool. Related fundraising efforts are therefore planned to be made jointly with other MEA Secretariats.
