

REPORT ON THE IMPLEMENTATION REVIEW OF THE ETF WORKPLAN 2018-2020

REPORT ON THE IMPLEMENTATION REVIEW OF THE ETF WORKPLAN 2018-2020

- 1. The CMS Energy Task Force has come to the end of its existing 2018-2020 work plan that has guided the direction of the Task Force over recent years. The 2018-2020 work plan included in this document (Annex 1) details the results and outputs of each of the seven key themes and associated actions, as initially identified by members and observers.
