- Possible additional range states: Bahrain, Maldives, Somalia, The Kingdom of Saudi Arabia

Activities and Outcomes

- Review the Conservation Strategy for Devil and Manta Rays
- Work with fishing communities => alternative livelihoods
- Work with communities and fishers to address bycatch
- Monitor and evaluate interventions

Concerted Action for the Asian Great Bustard (Otis tarda)

UNEP/CMS/COP12/Doc.26.2.8

- Submitted by the Government of Mongolia, with the Eurasian Bustard Alliance and the Wildlife Research and Conservation Center of Mongolia
- In Asia, population of 2,000-3,500.
- Will be implemented in Iran (Islamic Republic Of), Mongolia, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, Uzbekistan (CMS Parties), Turkmenistan, China and the Russian Federation (Non-Parties).











Activities and Outcomes

- Main activity update the existing Action Plan dating from 1998 and produce a revised, updated version ready for adoption at COP13
- Other activities include community engagement, law enforcement, new/enlarged protected areas, research, etc.
- Improved knowledge on the status of the Asian Great Bustard -Established network of experts across the region - Better understanding of threats - Transboundary cooperation -Population decline stopped and reversed
