Key information on ACPMEAs

- A Programme initiated in 2009, in its second phase
- Coordinated by the Law Division at UN Environment
- Financed through the 10th European Development Fund
- 11 million Euros for a period of 4 years (2014-2017, extended to 2018), of which Euro **6.47 million** budgeted for UN environment, and the other part for the FAO
- 79 of the African, Caribbean, and Pacific group of countries
- 84 activities over 4 years



- Support the process of facilitating Pacific ACP countries to become parties to MEAs – effective engagement at MEA COPs and other meetings.
- Support the revision of National Environment Management
 Strategies (NEMS) to fully integrate national implementation of MEAs
- Support mainstreaming of MEAs objectives into national development planning process










Pacific: MEAs and national planning processes, recent results

- **Drafting of the National Environment Policy for** Vanuatu, and NEMS for Tuvalu.
- Review of the Republic of the Marshall Islands (RMI)' 1994 NEMS and development the new RMI NEMS following on from the RMI SOE (State Of **Environment Report)**
- **Results: MEA commitments** embedded in NEMS plans and policy and mainstreamed into national strategies and development plans





























Pacific: National Enforcement Activities 2017 / 2018

- Environmental Impact Assessment training 2017: Cook Islands, FSM, Fiji (EIA refresher & SEA – strategic environmental Assessment intro), Nauru
- Revision of Compliance Manual and Development of Sand Mining Guidelines Sand Mining Guidelines will be a model for the region
- Publication and launch of French version of Regional EIA Guidelines
- Initiate development of EIA regulations in Nauru, Develop EIA Training Manual
- **EIA Guidelines for Coastal Tourism**

- FSM EIA guidelines, SEA guide




















What's next?
