Ratification of CMS in Australia



- Australia ratified CMS in 1991
- Facilitated the protection of a range of native species including:
 - Marine turtles
 - Dugong
 - Crocodile
 - Whales and dolphins
 - Shorebirds
 - Albatross and petrels
 - Sharks and rays

Matters of National Environmental Significance



Under Australian environmental law there are eight matters of national environmental significance:

- listed threatened species and ecological communities
- migratory species protected under international agreements
- Ramsar wetlands of international importance
- the Commonwealth marine environment
- World Heritage properties
- National Heritage places
- Great Barrier Reef Marine Park, and
- Nuclear actions.

National Implementation



- CMS is implemented through the Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999 (EPBC Act) migratory species list (section 209).
- Migratory species list must include:
 - (a) all migratory species that are:
 - (i) native species; and
 - (ii) from time to time included in the appendices to the **Bonn Convention**; and
 - (b) all **migratory species** from time to time included in annexes established under **JAMBA** and **CAMBA**; and
 - (c) all native species from time to time identified in a list established under, or an instrument made under, an international agreement approved by the Minister under subsection (4) [ROKAMBA]
- The list must not include any other species.

Offence provisions under the EPBC Act

Commonwealth areas

- Once listed as migratory, it becomes an offence to kill, injure, take, trade, keep or move the species in Commonwealth areas.
- If a species is listed on Appendix I or II of the CMS, Australia is obligated to list the species as migratory under the EPBC Act.
- No distinction between Appendices.




State land and waters


- Any action that has, will have, or is likely to have, a significant impact on these matters of national environmental significance must be referred to Australia's Environment Minister for decision.
- An 'action' is defined broadly as a project, a development, an undertaking, an activity or a series of activities, or an alteration of any of these things.

National Landcare Program

- The Australian Government's
 National Landcare Program invested
 \$1 billion over four years from 2014 15 to help drive sustainable
 agriculture as well as supporting the protection, conservation and rehabilitation of Australia's natural environment.
- For example, across Australia, the National Landcare Program invested approximately \$26 million in migratory birds and their habitats.
- A further \$1 billion was announced in the 2017 Commonwealth Budget.



National Environmental Science Programme


 The National Environmental Science Programme will assist decisionmakers to understand, manage and conserve Australia's environment by funding world-class biodiversity and climate science.
