**COMPILATION OF EXISTING CONSERVATION STRATEGIES AND NATIONAL ACTION
PLANS, DEVELOPED FOR THE CONSERVATION OF THE PERSIAN LEOPARD (*PANTHERA
PARDUS TULLIANA*)**

Introduction

1. Large cats such as the Persian Leopard *Panthera pardus tulliana* live at very low densities, often in the range of 1–3 mature individuals per 100 km², sometimes even less, rarely more. Such low abundance implies that viable populations need an extended range in the magnitude of many thousands of square kilometres. In our modern world, the distribution range of leopards is fragmented through human-made infrastructure and agricultural lands, and the best remaining habitats for wildlife are mostly in remote areas, in the mountains, and in border regions. The transboundary nature of most of the important remnant populations of the Persian Leopard implies that for its conservation, countries sharing such populations should work together to ensure that conservation measures are being applied on either side of the border.
2. The Species Survival Commission of the International Union for the Conservation of Nature (IUCN SSC) recommends a careful strategic planning for species conservation¹, especially in the case where international cooperation is needed (IUCN SSC Species Conservation Planning Sub-Committee 2017; Breitenmoser et al. 2014). In the case of widely distributed cat species, the IUCN SSC Cat Specialist Group recommends² to develop a range-wide *Conservation Strategy* as an over-arching document for more detailed and precisely tailored *National Action Plans* guiding the actual conservation approach for each Range State.
3. The present document lists international and national conservation plans that had been developed for the conservation of the Persian Leopard to date³:
