The CMS Family Online Reporting System (ORS) has been successfully implemented and used by AEWA in their last Meeting of the Parties (MOP 5, 2012) reporting cycle. The return of the eagle now comes up to 51 breeding pairs in Denmark in 2013. Where necessary, public access around the nest sites has been prohibited.
