- 1. New research or conservation projects related to marine turtles and/or their habitats
- ❖ Ten Billion Tree Tsunami Programme/Green Pakistan Project (by MoCC and provincial wildlife departments): Wildlife Component of Balochistan and Sindh include the conservation of marine turtles
- **Monitoring of nesting sites of Green Turtles at Hawksbay Jiwani beach, Karachi**;
- Sustainable Fisheries Entrepreneurship Project (SFEP) Phase-III;
- Ocean Clean A scoping study conducted as part of the Ocean Cleanup Project for Tackling Plastic Pollution Initiative;
- **Awareness-raising on the conservation of marine turtles.**

- 2. Large infrastructure developments affecting marine turtles and/or their habitats (proposed or underway)
- I. There are two <u>hotspots</u>; Hawksbay-Sandspit beach, Karachi (Sindh), and Daran beach (Balochistan), <u>which are the main</u> Green Turtle nesting grounds in Pakistan.
- II. The Green turtle habitat on Hawksbay has already constructed Huts on the beach, and Daran is a remote beach.
- III. Infrastructure has been noticed on Daran beach -where the beach area is cleared for constructing fractures to promote ecotourism- is stopped.

3. Changes in national policy, laws, or management frameworks affecting marine turtles and/or their habitats

All the marine turtle species are <u>covered under</u> the National Laws and International Conventions that include:

- The Pakistan Trade Control of Wild Fauna and Flora Act 2012 (CITES Law)
- · Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species (CITES)
- · CITES Management Authority bans the export of reptiles
- · Clause 5(c) of Pakistan <u>Fish Inspection and Quality Control Rules</u>, 1998, notified vide S.R.O. No.739(I)/9
- Protected under all provincial/territorial wildlife laws
- In 2017, under the Balochistan Wildlife (Protection, Preservation, Conservation, and Management) Act, 2014, Astola Island in District Gwadar, Balochistan, was declared a Marine Protected Area (401.47 sq.Km)
- Sindh Wildlife (Protection, Preservation, Conservation, and Management) Act 2020 has provisions for Marine Protected Areas
- <u>Declaration of Indus Delta Marine Protected Area is under consideration</u>
- · <u>National Biodiversity Strategy and Action Plan (NBSAP) includes the conservation of marine ecosystems.</u>

4. Emerging threats or challenges (incl. those caused/aggravated by the pandemic)

- i. Coastal Development (Infrastructure development at <u>Hawk</u>sbay);
 - ii. i.By-catch and entanglement in fishing gears;
- iii. Plastic pollution, discarded fishing gear, and other debris;
- iv. <u>Direct take and killing of turtles for illegal trade at the</u> local level (hatchlings);
- v. <u>Eggs and juvenile depredation by feral dogs and other</u> <u>predators;</u>
- vi. Climate Change impacts the natural sex ratios of hatchlings and increases the likelihood of disease outbreaks has not been explored;
- vii. Limited information on genetics and diseases;
- viii. Lack of proper rehabilitation facilities;
- ix. Lack of resources for monitoring all the remotes' nesting grounds;
- x. limited coverage of monitoring and reporting accidental catches from coastal fisheries.

5. Achievement/Success story:

Sustainable Fisheries Entrepreneurship Project (SFEP) Phase-III

<u>Promoting sustainable fishing practices</u> – training/awareness sessions on overfishing, accidental catches of megafauna, safe handling, and releases;

- A total of 20 training sessions were delivered, and trained 432 young fishers;
- Overall, 479 trained fishers; total of 20 Master Trainers;
- A total of ten gillnet vessels were converted to longline fishing gears;
- A total of nine sea turtles were safe releases by local fishers;
- A total of 20 ice boxes and 20 toolkits were distributed among the fishers;

Plastic pollution

- A total of 20 fisherwomen trained in waste segregation and waste management;
- Collaboration with the Sindh solid waste management board and GANSU (a third-party company engaged by SSWMB for the collection of garbage from the project site (Ibrahim Hyderi and Rehri)

Alternative livelihoods – sessions for fisherwomen

- Two training on conflict management were conducted with fisherwomen of the project area and trained 40 fisherwomen.
- Two health and hygiene awareness sessions were conducted with fisherwomen of the project area and trained 160 fisherwomen
- Alternative livelihood training is planned for this year for 15 fisherwomen on 4 trades1) Beauty parlor 2) Cloth stitching, 3) Nursing, and 4) Teaching.

5. Achievement/Success story:

Sustainable Fisheries Entrepreneurship Project (SFEP) Phase-III

Celebration of World Sea Turtle Day with the fisher communities.

Additional activities

- Supervised a student from A-levels in her plastic pollution project.
- Facilitated a master's student for the questionnaire for the survey of assessment of health and hygiene
- Interviews with the virtual university Pakistan on climate change and its impacts on our oceans and to FM91 on World Oceans Day- protecting priority species in Pakistan.
- Development of the 3D videos for safe handling and release of ETP species

Additional activities

Student Engagement

Over 500 students participated in various activities such as green workshops, mangrove plantations, mangrove transit walks, the release of turtle hatchlings, and a beach clean-up exercise.

Corporate Engagement

WWF-Pakistan, in collaboration with PepsiCo, launched the Ocean Clean A scoping study was conducted as part of the Ocean Cleanup Project, aiming to collect 5,000 tonnes of waste. A beach clean-up activity was carried out at Sea View to kick-start the project, and 2,000kg of waste was collected and disposed off.

5. Achievement/Success story:

Regional-level collaboration and contribution

- I. Virtual call meeting on Gillnet multitaxon bycatch mitigation. Ultimately, reporting to the working party of IOTC
- II. Supporting WWF-Mozambique for safely handling and releasing ETP species for gillnet fisheries and translation into African languages.
- III. Virtual meeting on introducing future-sea with shellcatch team for bycatch projects- Low-cost tech on data collection on bycatch.
- IV. Results Sharing and Low-cost Data Collection Workshop- Low-cost tech on data collection on a small scale and bycatch species in South Africa.
- V. Collaboration with Satlink to use the tech for combating the ghost gears from small-scale fisheries



























































Rapid assessment on mega fauna species bycatch in coastal waters





















