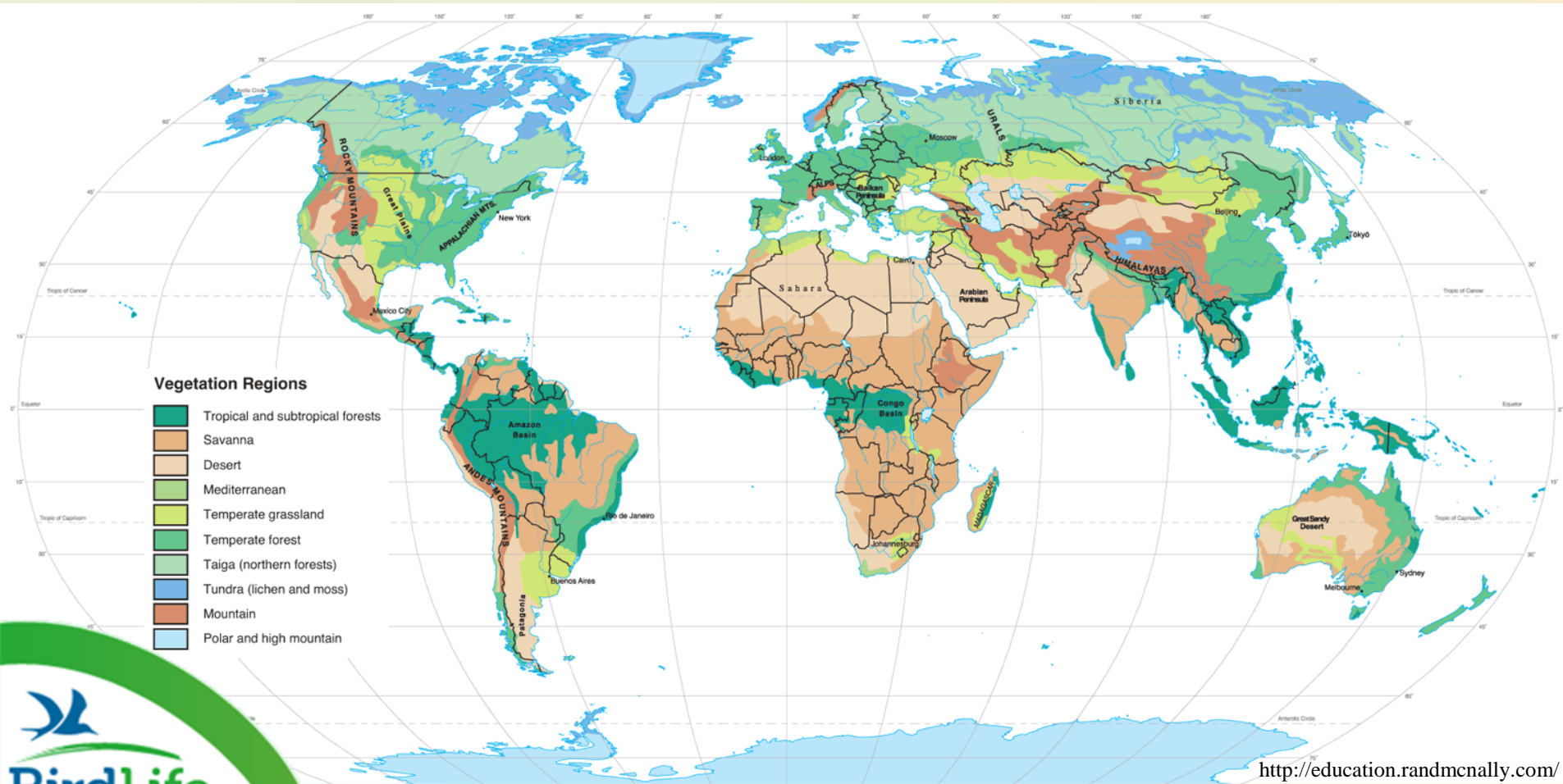

- **Steering Group**, a closed subset of the WG, coordinating the Action Plan development and implementation process.

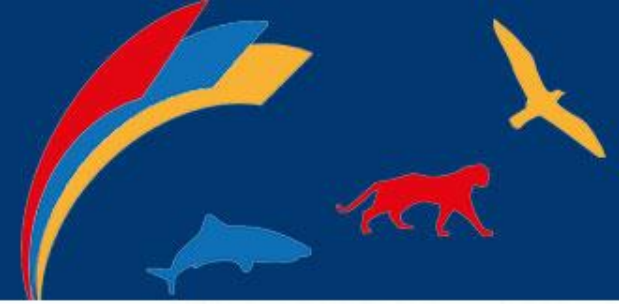

Dynamic list of **full migrants** that are principally ecologically dependent on terrestrial habitats, presently:

- 34 GtB (category A),
- 124 LC decreasing (category B), and
- 346 LC increasing, stable or unknown (category C).
