



- We are a network of scientists and conservationists working collaboratively, freely sharing our expertise and enthusiasm for saigas.

- Supporting in-country priority actions






Small Grants (since 2008)

- To support individual grass roots conservationists
- Simple form in English or Russian
- Support and engagement with SCA team
- Conserving saigas in the wild supporting CMS MTIWP
- \$2,000 or \$20,000 for a 1 year project
- Not for salaries or parts of big projects
- Supported 29 projects in 5 countries, awarded \$97,177
- Range of topics: research, protection, education

Anti-poaching awards (since 2014)

- To recognise excellence in anti-poaching work for saigas by an individual or a team
- Recognising very hard and dangerous work
- Award of \$1000 plus a certificate




Uzbekistan programme

- Education training teachers, cartoons, schoolbooks, videos, mural
- Public awareness Saiga Day, Steppe Wildlife Club
- Alternative livelihoods Embroidery project
- Saiga monitoring participatory monitors, scientific expeditions
- Supporting government designation of Saigachy reserve, ranger training, offsetting
- Research evaluating saiga programme, monitoring knowledge and attitudes, saiga distribution and ecology







Russia

- Supporting the Stepnoi reserve: anti-poaching, eco-tourism, public awareness, monitoring
- Supporting the Centre for Wild Animals: participatory monitoring, Yashkul' breeding centre, Saiga Days and educational work
- Small grants to several other people (e.g. V. Nostaeva for education, P. Amosov for saiga monitoring, E. Adgishev for linking Buddhism and saiga conservation)

 Working with ACBK on: public awareness, Saiga Days and Steppe Wildlife Clubs, MOU coordination, mass mortality investigation, participatory monitoring.

Mongolia

- Supporting young scientists; e.g. helped Bayarbaatar
 Buuveibaatar to get a WCN scholarship for his studies, and gave small grants for his ecological research
- Supported WWF-Mongolia's work with customs inspectors with a small grant





China

 Supported WCS-China with a series of small grants for work on market surveys and awareness-raising with public, government, traders and medical practitioners
