

Nesting Sea Turtles Currently Along Bangladesh Coast

















Large sand bag, RCC Structure installation on nesting beach for so called erosion prevention.





2. Large infrastructure developments affecting marine turtles

Several lliquefied natural gas (LNG) port terminal and coal-based power generation project have been started by the government at Matarbari and Haserchar nesting beaches. In addition, Sonadia Island has been leased by the Government to Economic Zone Authority (BEZA) for tourism development. Therefore, these nesting hotspots now under threat.

3. Changes in national policy, laws, or management frameworks affecting sea turtles and their habitats

- Bangladesh has introduced a monsoonal fishery closure in the Bay of Bengal to ensure the conservation of fish stocks and productive breeding grounds. This include one 63 days ban between May and July and another 22 days coastal Ban during winter.
- There is no special changes in existing wildlife law that can help sea turtle conservation.
- Major nesting beach at Sonadia Island, Haser Char, and adjacent areas is being under serious impact due to disturbance by LNG operation, LNG offshore fleet, through which lighting, noise garbage is a common issue now.

Emerging threats or challenges

- Beach front tourism development is rapidly increase at St. Martin Island, Cox Bazar area and already impacting nesting habitat.
- Government converted protected area Sonadia to Tourism Economic Zone
- LNG port and operation will increase habitat disturbance onshore and offshore

Achievement/Success story

- More than one million ridley hatchling released in the wild since 1996
- Migration routes known to some extend and Satellite Telemetry in ongoing. We have Flipper tagging program ongoing(BD 0001-BD2000 Inconel).
- Fishermen are engaged in conservation and bycatch mitigation
- Sea turtle are protected by Wildlife Protection Act (2012). TED use mandatory in mechanised trawler (but it may not be followed in reality).
- Government supported for a project through worldbank funding but still need to make a national program.
- Total Southeast coast is under conservation program.
- In last 8 years government declared 2 large MPA, St. Martin Island and adjacent area and Swatch of no Groud.
