
## Historical occurrence of Leopard



- Leopard requires large habitat range, and uses various landscape types
- By the beginning of the XX century biggest part of Georgia served as habitat of the species except of the Javakheti Plateau and South-East lowlands

## Occurrence of Persian Leopard in Georgia since 2000s

Vashlovani, 2004 Last recorded in Tusheti, 2021 Vashlovani PA, 2009





- National Conservation Status CR
- Strict protection due to the national legislation
- Priority taxon for the Vashlovani PA, Tusheti PA management plans
- Management plans aim to reintroduce the population of leopard prey and continue monitoring as per national
  action plan 2010-2014 (Outcome N2, N3, N6, Monitoring activities per outcome N7, N8, N10
- Conservation objectives reflected in the National Biodiversity Strategy and Action Plan 2014-2020


