

# **Convention on the Conservation of Migratory Species of Wild Animals**



# 48th Meeting of the Standing Committee

Bonn, Germany, 23 - 24 October 2018

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# **DOCUMENT MANAGEMENT AND SCHEDULING**

(Prepared by the Secretariat)

# Summary:

This document makes recommendations to the Standing Committee on two issues relating to the preparation of COP13: Document management and scheduling of subsidiary meetings.

# Scheduling in the lead-up to COP13

- At COP12, Parties accepted the offer by the Government of India to host COP13. Following
  further consultations, it has been decided to hold the meeting in Gandhinagar, the capital city
  of Gujarat State. Taking into consideration both the climate and the busy international
  environment calendar in 2020, the meeting has been scheduled for 17-22 February 2020.
- 2. The Secretariat has prepared a table outlining milestones and document deadlines in the lead-up to COP13 (see Annex 1).
- The date chosen for COP13 is eight to nine months earlier than CMS COPs are normally held. This in turn has compressed the intersessional period, which has implications for the intersessional meetings of the Standing Committee (StC) and the Sessional Committee of the Scientific Council (ScC-SC).
- 4. The timing of ScC-SC4 is governed by the COP document deadlines, as the meeting will review proposals for amendment of the Convention and its Appendices (to be submitted 150 days before COP). The Secretariat has set the week beginning either 4 or 11 November 2019 for this meeting.
- 5. The 49<sup>th</sup> meeting of the StC would normally be held around one year after the 48<sup>th</sup> meeting, in October 2019. However, this would fall just before Sc-ScC4 and in the middle of the various document deadlines. Another possibility would be between March and June of 2019, that is, just 6-9 months after this 48<sup>th</sup> meeting. Accordingly, the Secretariat would need to complete its draft StC documents two months earlier, i.e. between January and March 2019.
- 6. An additional question relates to the agenda of the 49<sup>th</sup> meeting. Members should carefully consider whether they would wish for another round of progress reports, to review the implementation of the CMS budget, and the Programme of Work so soon after the previous meeting.
- 7. The table provided in Annex 2 lists all decisions directed to the StC. The final column outlines the role foreseen for the StC at this time. In summary, if StC49 were convened between March and June 2019, it would be in a position to receive progress reports from the Secretariat and be asked to provide guidance on a few conservation initiatives and on COP13 preparations as it sees fit. It could also consider any cases brought to it under the Review Mechanism, if any were presented and processed in that time.
- 8. The StC is requested to advise on the necessity of holding StC49 during the intersessional period, on a suitable date, and on agenda items to be discussed.

#### Document handling

- With the introduction of the Sessional Committee of the Scientific Council following COP11, and its timing, approximately four months before COP, the Secretariat had to adopt a number of new document handling practices.
- 10. Now that one cycle is complete under this new regime, the Secretariat has had an opportunity to review how these practices worked, and to take on board feedback from Parties and other stakeholders. In light of this, we propose some modifications and improvements.

# I. Proposals to Amend the Appendices

#### 1. ScC-SC Comments on Proposals:

# Mandate: CMS Resolution 12.4, Annex, paragraph. 12c

"assessing proposals for the amendment of Appendices I and II from a scientific and technical standpoint, and providing advice to the Conference of the Parties regarding proposed amendments;"

#### COP12 Procedure:

- Comments arising from the ScC-SC meeting were appended to the proposal, so that
  the recommendations were clearly distinguishable from the proposal itself. These
  were posted online on the COP document webpage as soon as possible after the
  meeting.
- However, not all comments were systematically sent to proponents for their information or action.

#### Recommendation for COP13:

- a) We recommend the same procedure to append ScC-SC comments to the proposals.
- b) In addition, the Secretariat will systematically send a copy of comments to all relevant proponents for their information and possible action.

# 2. Comments by Parties on Proposals:

# Mandate: CMS, Article X, paragraph 3:

"Any comments on the text [of a proposed amendment] by the Parties shall be communicated to the Secretariat not less than 60 days before the meeting begins".

#### COP12 Procedure:

- After the 60-day deadline, all comments were compiled into a single document, and posted on the web. (see UNEP/CMS/COP12/Doc.25.1/Add.1).
- There was no formal process to inform all proponents of these comments.

#### Recommendation for COP13:

- a) We recommend the same procedure; that after the 60-day deadline, all comments will be compiled into one document, and posted on the meeting website.
- b) In addition, the Secretariat will inform all proponents of Party comments on their proposals as soon as possible after receipt by the Secretariat.

# 3. Comments by Inter-governmental bodies on Proposals:

#### Mandate: Res. 11.33, Para 5:

"Requests the Secretariat to consult other relevant intergovernmental bodies, including RFMOs, having a function in relation to any species subject to a proposal for amendment of the Appendices....".

#### COP12 Procedure:

- As with the Party comments, and using the same deadline, all comments were compiled into one document and posted on the web. (see UNEP/CMS/COP12/Doc.25.1/Add.2).
- Again, there was no systematic process to inform all proponents of these comments.

#### Recommendation for COP13:

- a) As with the Party comments, and at the same time, all comments will be compiled into one document, and posted on the meeting website.
- b) The Secretariat will inform all proponents of IGO comments on their proposals as soon as possible after they are posted.

### 4. Revisions of Proposals by proponents:

Mandate: Rule 21, paragraph 2 of the Rules of Procedure (below) allow proponents to amend proposals at any time. A footnote clarifies how this relates to the scope of the proposal, but is silent on amendments which amount to improvements to background information.

"The Representative of the Party that has submitted a proposal for amendment of Appendices I or II may, at any time, withdraw the proposal or amend it to reduce its scope<sup>2</sup> or to make it more precise. Once a proposal has been withdrawn, it may not be re-submitted during the meeting. Once a proposal has been amended to reduce its scope, it may not be reamended during the meeting to increase the scope of the amended proposal".

Footnote 2: The phrase "reduce its scope" includes situations, such as amending a proposal to include a species in Appendix I so as to include that same species in Appendix II; and amending a species listing proposal to include fewer populations. However, it does not include situations, such as amending a proposal to include a species in Appendix II to include that same species in Appendix I; or amending a species listing proposal to add populations to the proposal or include different populations in the proposal.

# COP12 Procedure and Practice:

- The majority of comments that requested revisions related to technical improvements, adding or clarifying information. These did not impact the scope of the proposal.
- While some proponents submitted amendments based on these comments to the Secretariat in good time, others submitted them just before or immediately after the opening of COP.
- It was extremely difficult for the Secretariat to issue revisions of proposals at this time.

#### Recommendation for COP13:

#### Option 1:

- a) The Secretariat recommends adopting the procedure employed by the CITES Secretariat, i.e. we would not accept amendments to the text of the proposal after the submission deadline.
- b) If deemed necessary, the Secretariat may append its own comments to the proposal, including notes on any errors in species name, geographic distribution etc.
- c) If proponents wish to provide additional information to address issues raised by the ScC or Parties in their comments, they would be welcome to provide an addendum to the proposal. It would help the Secretariat if there was a deadline for the submission of such addenda, the Secretariat recommends a deadline of 30 days before COP.

d) The above would not prevent proponents from reducing the scope of their proposal at any time, in accordance with the ROP.

#### Option 2:

e) In the event that Parties prefer to maintain the ability to re-work proposals in light of comments received, it would help the Secretariat if there was a deadline for such technical revisions. The Secretariat recommends a deadline of 30 days before COP.

# II. COP documents with a scientific component submitted by Parties, the Secretariat or bodies other than the Scientific Council

# Mandate: Rule 22, paragraph 3 of the COP Rules of Procedure:

"All proposed Resolutions and Decisions that include a scientific element shall be submitted by the Executive Secretary to the Scientific Council for scrutiny of their scientific and technical accuracy at least 120 days prior to the commencement of the meeting. The Scientific Council shall provide appropriate advice to the Standing Committee on all proposed Resolutions and Decisions".

#### COP12 Procedure and Practice:

• As for proposals to amend the Appendices, comments by the ScC-SC on proposed Resolutions and Decisions were appended to each document.

#### Recommendation for COP13:

a) Maintain the same procedure.

# III. COP documents submitted by the Scientific Council (including its working groups and members)

#### COP12 Procedure and Practice:

- To meet the document deadline, documents arising from working groups of the ScC or prepared by individual members had to be finalized and posted before the ScC-SC meeting. These documents were then discussed at the ScC-SC meeting and comments were collated. These comments were appended to the documents, in the same way as their comments on documents submitted by Parties, the Secretariat and other bodies.
- It was felt by many that the ScC should be able to amend its own documents for presentation to COP.

#### Recommendation for COP13:

a) All documents submitted by the ScC will be amended after the ScC-SC meeting, to incorporate any comments made during that meeting, so as to present to COP their collective, consolidated opinion.

# IV. COP Decisions regarding reporting to subsidiary bodies.

#### COP12 Procedure and Practice:

- COP12 saw the introduction of Decisions, a new output in addition to the existing Resolutions. These decisions were drafted by a variety of stakeholders and were not always consistent.
- The process to repeal outdated resolutions, undertaken at COP12, resulted in a number of operative paragraphs of old resolutions being converted to Decisions.
- As such, a number of COP12 decisions and even some resolutions contain provisions requesting the Secretariat or ScC to report to subsequent meetings of the StC.
- However, in many of these cases the StC is simply required to consider a report of the Secretariat/ScC and make any recommendations it considers appropriate to COP (see for example Decisions 12.49, 12.58 and 12.87 contained in Annex 2).

#### Recommendation for COP13:

- a) The StC may wish to provide the following guidance to the Parties, the Secretariat and others drafting documents for COP13:
  - ➤ Decisions should only contain the instruction to report back to StC or ScC if there are specific, concrete actions to be taken by that body at that meeting (see for example Decisions 12.3, 12.5 and 12.7 contained in Annex 2).

# Action requested:

The Standing Committee is invited to:

- a) Advise on the necessity of holding StC49 during the intersessional period, and if appropriate, on a suitable date, and agenda items to be discussed.
- b) Provide guidance on the recommendations for handling documents in the lead-up to COP13.
