	6.1 Review of the status of Great Bustard populations in the agreement area	UNEP/CMS/GB/2/Doc.6	The Secretariat will introduce that portion of the Overview Report addressing the Great Bustard's conservation status within the agreement area. An intervention on the relevant outcomes from the Scientific Symposium may be invited. After this comments from the individual Signatory States and the signing organisations will be invited. Conclusions will be drawn. The meeting may then wish to consider the conservation status of the Great Bustard outside of the agreement area and invite interventions from observer States and signing organisations. Expected outcome: The meeting takes note of the Secretariat's Overview Report and provides additional information as well as guidance on how it could be improved if necessary; information shared on the conservation status of the Great Bustard within the agreement area; possible additional information shared on the Great Bustard's conservation status outside of the agreement area.

Signatory States will then <i>inter alia</i> be invited to confirm the existence of their national work programme and any problems/gaps in their establishment and implementation. Informal indications as to the need to amend Part II of the AP will be invited. The meeting will be invited to consider how best to measure progress under the MoU and AP, both in terms of national level actions and overall conservation and management outcomes for the Great Bustard. Expected outcome: Information shared on the status of MoU and Action Plan (AP) implementation within the agreement area and at national levels; confirmation that national work programmes are in place or being developed; implementation gaps identified by country and possible means to fill gaps identified; informal indications by Signatory States provided as to the need to amend the country-specific actions in Part II of the AP; suggestions provided on how best to measure progress under the MoU and AP both in terms of national level actions and overall conservation and management outcomes for the Great Bustard; the extent to which the present Overview Report's format is appropriate for measuring progress and outcomes. Guidance given as to the need for additional tools to measure the effectiveness of the MoU and AP.

	7.2 Setting up an Advisory Panel on Reintroduction and Captive Breeding	UNEP/CMS/GB/2/Doc.5	The MTIWP provides for the setting up of a Technical Advisory Panel of international experts to coordinate reintroduction and restocking projects. A proposal concerning the establishment of the panel including draft Terms of Reference (ToR) has been prepared by the Secretariat. The meeting will be invited to review the Secretariat's proposal, finalize the draft ToR and approve the establishment of the Advisory Panel, giving mandate to the Secretariat to proceed with its establishment according to the agreed procedure. Expected outcome: ToR for the Advisory Panel finalized and adopted.

	7.3 MoU coordination		The CMS Secretariat acts as the secretariat to MoUs developed under CMS auspices at no cost to the MoU signatories. However, when feasible and appropriate it can outsource some aspects of the MoU coordination to range states and/or collaborating organizations to support a range of activities including meeting preparation, project development and fundraising, membership development and awareness raising. Following the 1 st meeting of the Signatories, an arrangement has been in place providing for the appointment of two part-time coordinators, with financial support from the Government of Austria. This arrangement will not be continued in the same terms. The meeting will be invited to consider options for the future coordination of the MoU. Signatory States or collaborating organizations willing to provide

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			financial and/or in kind support towards MoU coordination will be invited to illustrate their offers.
			Expected outcome : General consideration of the MoU coordination issue; guidance provided and options identified on the particular issue of outsourcing MoU coordination activities, including financial considerations.
