- Global Gateway: Mobilising EUR 300 billion by 2027 (150 billion in Africa)
- GG aligned to the European Green Deal objectives
- GG promoting high environmental & social standards
- Three goals at the heart of the GG
 - Resilience
 - Sustainability
 - Cooperation with neighbours and like-minded partners





- Commitment to promote the principles of Quality
 Infrastructure
- 'Do Good' and 'Do No Harm' work hand-in-hand
- Red line: anything contrary to the country's NDC



Strategic Corridors under GG

- 11 strategic corridors in Africa for EU support
- Multi-criteria analysis and ranking by scenarios
 - 5 Biodiversity and Sustainability Indicators
 - Green scenario





Committed to biodiversity and climate action

- Biodiversity a priority in country programmes
- Commitments to biodiversity funding
- NaturAfrica: flagship initiative for conservation of key biodiversity landscapes





Understanding EU support

- Grant-based –EC not a financial institution
- Much of support to large-scale infrastructure as <u>blended finance</u>
- EU brings additionality often environmental
 - Could be e.g. eco-ducts, eco-bridges, fish ladders, climate proofing






Understanding EU support

- Rely on E&S standards and safeguards of partner Fls – often modeled on those of the IFC
- Dialogue with FIs and national partners in building project pipelines
- Promoting inter-modal transport
 - Railways and water transport –
 'tunnel effect' + CC mitigation benefits






Under 'traditional' aid





Guidelines




- Screening procedure
