Summary: This document presents the TAG Workplan 2023-2026, explaining the sources of the different actions that the Workplan brings together. The Meeting is invited to adopt the document.

- From the Second Meeting of Signatories (MOS2, Trondheim, October 2015) until the present meeting, the work of the Technical Advisory Group to the Raptors MOU (TAG) was guided by the TAG Workplan 2016-2020 (see Annex A to document <u>UNEP/CMS/Raptors/TAG4/Doc.6.1</u> [only available in English]).
- 2. At the Fifth Meeting of the Technical Advisory Group (TAG5, Online, December 2022), the Coordinating Unit presented a proposal for a follow-up workplan, i.e. a TAG Workplan 2023-2026 (see document UNEP/CMS/Raptors/TAG5/Doc.2 [only available in English]). TAG members discussed the proposal at the meeting, agreeing to the Coordinating Unit implementing certain modifications to it and circulating a revised version of the document for the Group's approval after the meeting (see document UNEP/CMS/RAPTORS/TAG5/Report [only available in English]).
- 3. The TAG Workplan 2023-2026 version approved by the TAG following TAG5 is presented in Annex 1 below. The document compiles the actions relevant to the TAG that are foreseen in the following documents:
 - (a) Unimplemented actions listed in the TAG Workplan 2016-2020 that are still considered relevant;
 - (b) Terms of Reference of the TAG;
 - (c) Rules of Procedure for Meetings of Signatories to the Raptors MOU, as adopted at MOS2 (see Annex I to document <a href="https://www.unepscharge.com/unepsc
 - (d) Actions agreed at the Fourth Meeting of the Technical Advisory Group to the Raptors MOU (TAG4, Online, December 2021; see document UNEP/CMS/Raptors/TAG4/Report); and
 - (e) Activities contained in Table 2 of the Raptors MOU Action Plan, as refined and updated following TAG4 (see paragraph 388 of document UNEP/CMS/Raptors/TAG4/Report).
