# FIRST RANGE STATE WORKSHOP ON OF THE EUROPEAN EEL

Galway, Ireland, October 2016

- Co-organized by the CMS Secretariat and the Sargasso Sea Commission.
- Brought together Range States and experts on European and American eel.
- To update countries on the status of eel conservation and management.
- Measures discussed included
  - extension of the management regimes to other Range States & mechanisms to support such activities,
  - protection of the crucial spawning areas in the high seas areas of the Sargasso Sea.





# FIRST RANGE STATE WORKSHOP ON OF THE EUROPEAN EEL

#### Outcomes Key Elements of a future agreement

- Objective: Recovery of the eel stocks.
- need to take a flexible approach to measures within any international instrument.
- Non-duplication of scientific knowledge, using existing scientific bodies for advice.
- Identify key partners that would work closely with the instrument, including Regional Seas, (Barcelona Convention, HELCOM etc.), RFMOs (eg GCFM)



## FIRST RANGE STATE WORKSHOP ON OF THE EUROPEAN EEL

#### Follow Up

- Convene 2<sup>nd</sup> meeting including North Africa
- Questionnaire to identify gaps to be sent to Range States
- Feasibility assessment of including American eel in Instrument
- Feasibility of Sargasso Sea protection under possible international instrument
- Bring to the attention of CMS Parties
- Brief GCFM on status

### CONCERTED ACTION ON THE EUROPEAN EEL

**UNEP/CMS/** Concerted Action 12.1

- Organise a second workshop of Range States.
- Undertake a survey of Range States to identify gaps in conservation and management of the species.
- Identify actions that complement both the 2016 CITES COP17 decision and the IUCN World Conservation Council 2016 Resolution that relate to anguillid eels.
- Encourage improved data flow/collection to ICES for annual reporting and AESG for Red List assessment in 2018.
- Engage with non-Range State stakeholders e.g. relevant Regional Fisheries Bodies, especially the General Fisheries Commission for the Mediterranean (GFCM).
