CMS has two Appendices as designated by the original convention text:

- Appendix I contains migratory species that are endangered, taking is prohibited with limited exception
- Appendix II contains species with unfavorable conservation status, taking is allowed but restricted



Amendment Process

- 1. Member states submit proposed amendments to species listings
- 2. The Scientific Council reviews the proposal and advises the COP on their scientific merit
- Proposals are voted on at the COP, they are adopted if 2/3 of Parties support their approval
- Changes to Appendixes take effect after 90 days

Species Proposals Include:

- Species Classification
- Biological data including species range, population, etc.
- Data outlining direct and indirect threats to conservation
- Protection Status
- Comments from Range States
