

ENHANCE

Communication, **Education** and **Participation** and **Awareness (CEPA)** of the values of migratory waterbirds and their habitats



ENHANCE

Flyway research and monitoring activities, build knowledge and promote exchange of information on waterbirds and their habitats



BUILD

Habitat and waterbird management capacity of **natural resource managers**, **decision makers** and **local stakeholders**



DEVELOP

Especially for **priority species** and habitats, flyway wide approaches to enhance the **conservation status of migratory waterbirds**




Flyway Site Network

- Flyway Network Sites: **152** from 19 countries


1000+ Important sites

- Designated by Government







EAAFP way forward: Regional Flyway Initiative (RFI)

RFI Long-term Vision and Delivery Timeframe

Will deliver 50+ flyway sites under Protection / Sustainable Management providing a coherent network of priority sites for 10 EAAF countries with favorable conservation status with species numbers maintained or enhanced on the EAAF.



Partnership

Delivery Timeframe

Comprising of 2 stages:

i) DEVELOPMENT STAGE

Grant finance 2021 – 2023 (2yrs) \$1 million secured

ii) INVESTMENT STAGE

Loan / Grant Blend 2023 onwards (10+yrs) **\$3 billion target**



Development Stage Delivery

Implemented by consortium led by BLI with an international team including EAAFP, Wetlands International, Paulson Institute, NUS, & others





