## Subject: Agenda items for discussion proposed by the European Union and its Member States at the third meeting of the Signatories (MoS3) to the Memorandum of Understanding on the conservation of migratory sharks (Sharks MoU)

Dear Mrs Melanie Virtue,

In view of the forthcoming Meeting of the Signatories to the Sharks MoU, the European Union and its Member States would like to propose two additional discussion points for MoS3 aiming at strengthening the functioning of the instrument.

## **1. Performance review**

*Rationale:* for Parties, such as the EU, involved in and supporting, including financially, the work of international organisations, it is increasingly important to periodically review the performance of these bodies, not only to determine their effectiveness and efficiency in relation to achieving their core objectives, but also to better assess the capacities and mechanisms these organisations have put in place to support the achievement of these objectives. In line with best practices in modern governance any international arrangement should undergo periodically an external and independent review process in order to obtain reliable information about its performance in terms of achieving the objectives for which is was set up and the factors that might affect its performance. We propose to initiate the discussion at MoS3 on such a process for the Sharks MoU, with the aim of identifying what functions well and/or what can or should be addressed in order to improve its performance towards achieving its objectives.

# **2.** Strengthen the modalities and criteria for Amending Annex 1 of the MoU and the role of the Advisory Committee in this process

*Rationale:* With a view to completing the framework of the MoU, anticipating the effective and successful implementation of the Conservation Plan and the achievement of a favourable conservation status for the species listed under the Annex 1 of the MoU, we propose to discuss the opportunity for considering a process, which would allow formally reviewing periodically the status of species listed on Annex 1 of the MoU and informing MoS about progress towards achieving a favourable conservation status. This would require strengthening the capacity and functioning of the Advisory Committee and fine-tuning key concepts related to the listing process.

It is also essential to consider strengthening the composition and the robustness of the outputs of the Advisory Committee of the Sharks MoU, in view to progressively acquiring a high level of recognition of its expertise at international level.

We are looking forward engaging a constructive discussion with other Signatories on these important concepts; therefore, I would appreciate if these items could be added to the MoS3 agenda.
