














2.3 Instruments under CMS

- **Appendix I of CMS**: migratory species that are threatened with extinction
- **Appendix II of CMS**: further migratory species needing or significantly benefitting from international cooperation. These species, either individually or by taxonomic group, are the basis for establishing instruments – regional or global – under CMS.

2.5 Funding of the CMS Family

Assessed contributions:

Each Party to a legally binding-instrument (CMS and Agreements) is required to financially contribute to the budget adopted by the decision-making body

➤ CMS: in accordance with the UN scale of assessment as agreed by the UN General Assembly adjusted to take account of the membership of CMS

>Agreements:

- > UN scale of assessment
- ➤ Own guidelines and methods to determine each Party's contribution

2.5 Funding of the CMS Family

Voluntary contributions:

- > CMS and Agreements:
 - > normally complement assessed contributions
 - fund projects and other initiatives that are not covered by the regular budget
 - ➤ NFPs are informed by secretariats about funding needs to complement core resources.

> MoUs:

- > Ad hoc voluntary contributions from Signatories
- ➤ Combination of voluntary contributions, financial support from CMS and in-kind assistance from partner organizations

3.3 Financial Matters

Assessed contributions:

An important aspect of the NFP's work is to oversee and ensure the prompt and full payment of the annual contributions to the CMS and instruments.
