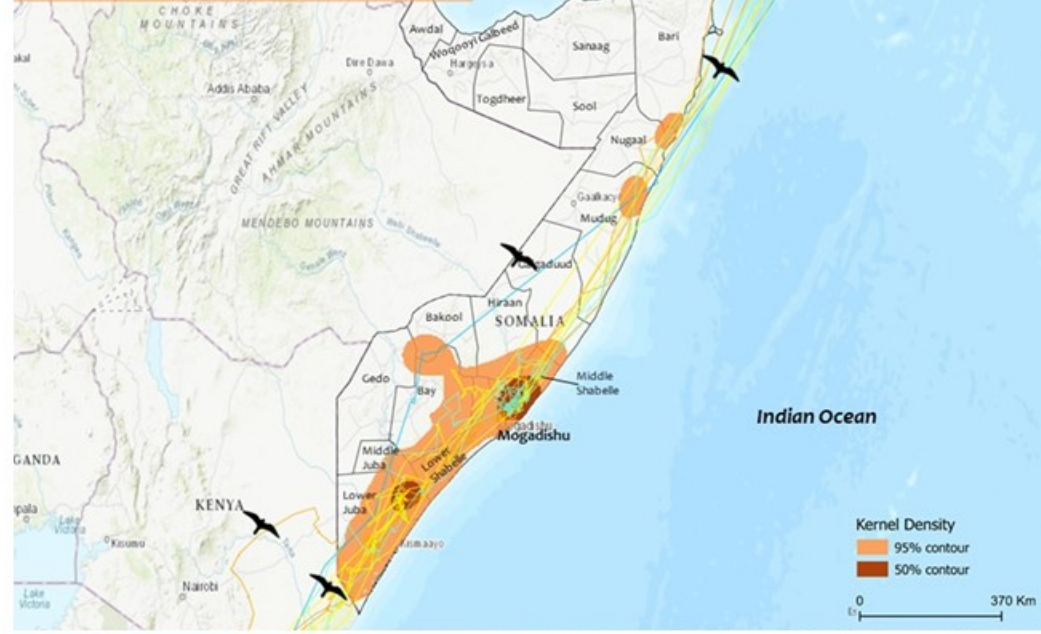

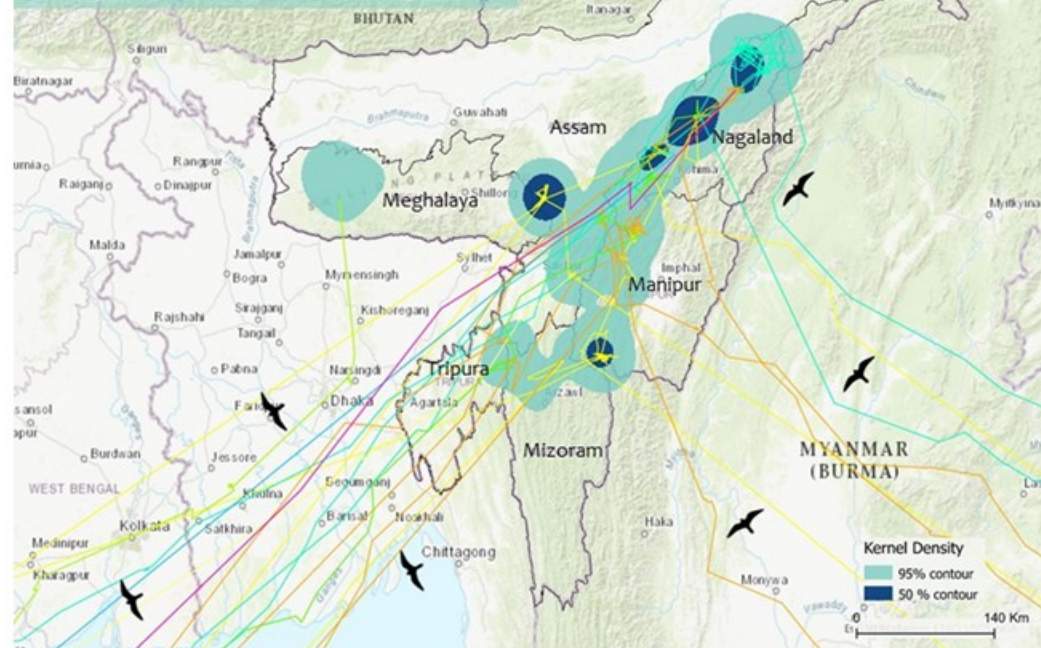

- Few vulture tracking projects have been initiated

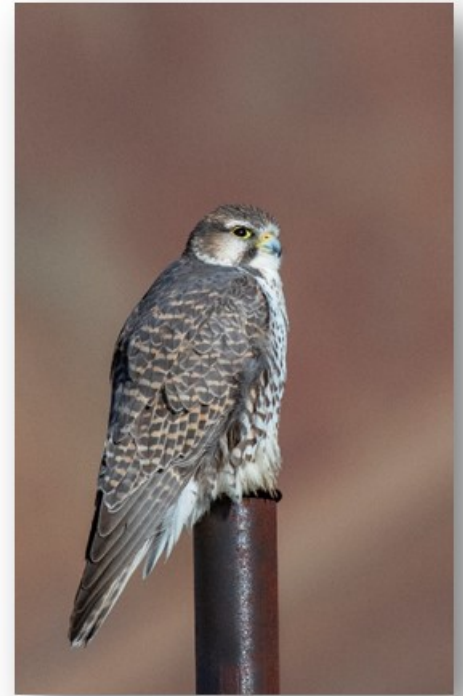

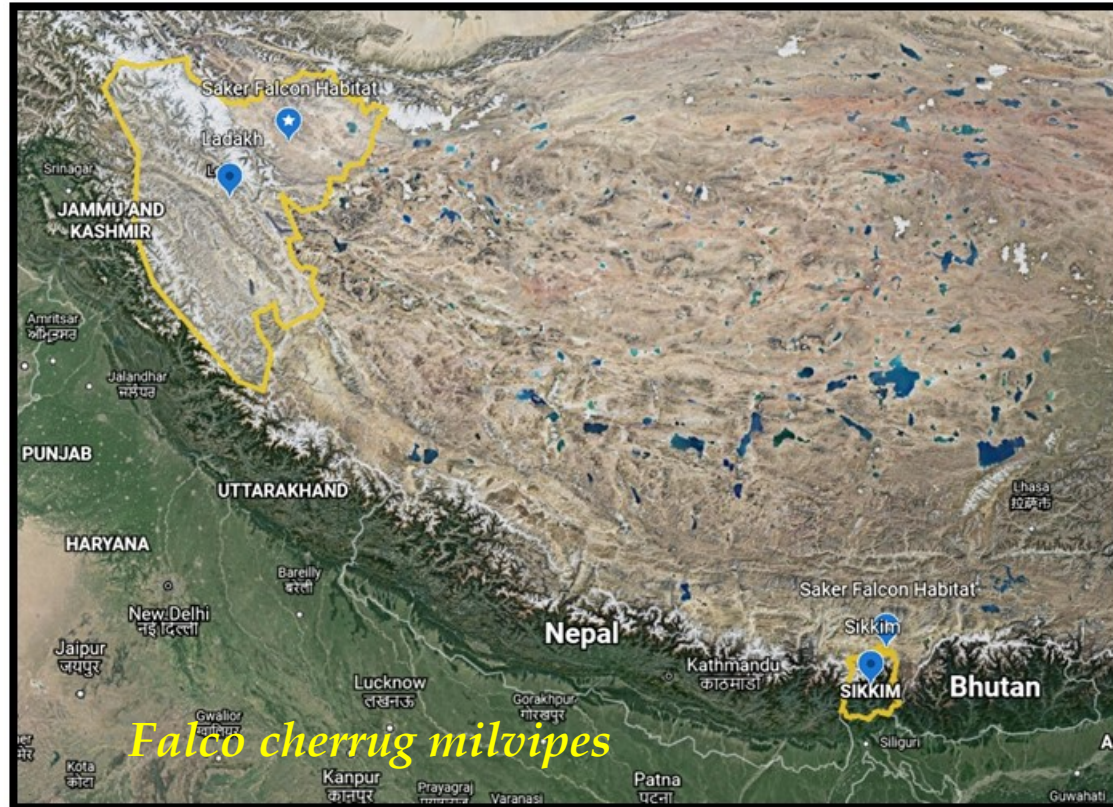

- *Darker crown*
- *Full moustache*
- *Barred boldly on thighs and flanks*

High numbers of Black-lipped Pika *Ochotona curzoniae* in the area appears to support Saker Falcon populations year round
