7. Review of implementation progress		
The meeting will have before it a detailed review of reporting and implementation, which can be used as a basis for identifying priorities for strategic intervention, as well as related resource needs. The discussion will be structured as follows:

General discussion of national reporting to date and comprehensive review of implementation progress, strengths and weaknesses/gaps. A synthesis of the core reports has been prepared by the Secretariat, using information contained in the IOSEA Online Reporting Facility as of early July 2014. A separate paper explains, by way of specific examples, the value and practical application of site-based information on species/habitats, threats and mitigation measures contained in the Online Reporting Facility. (b) Recommendations arising from species assessments		
The Leatherback Assessment (updated online in 2012) and Loggerhead Assessment (published in 2013) both contain valuable recommendations that can serve as the basis for the design and implementation of specific follow-up projects. (c) National networks/committees		
Signatory States have been requested to summarise steps taken to establish and effectively use national networks/committees to coordinate national sea turtle conservation efforts. A paper prepared by the Secretariat, based on questionnaire results from Signatory States, presents the key findings. The discussion is expected to focus on the importance of national committees and any impediments to their establishment and effective function. (d) Sub-regional groups and related coordination mechanisms		
Each of the 4 IOSEA sub-regions will meet collectively at least once and will report on their deliberations to plenary (discussions to be led by sub-regional Focal Points or alternates). Presentations will be invited from representatives of existing sub-regional arrangements, such as the WIO – Marine Turtle Task Force. 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(e)	Current use and further development of online implementation tools The Secretariat will inform the meeting about the latest developments concerning the IOSEA website, including tools intended to benefit Signatory States and other interested partners in relation to their marine turtle conservation activities, such as the new International Flipper Tag Recovery Database, Satellite Tracking Metadatabase, Bibliography Resource, Project Database, etc.	Inf. 8	Participants will be asked to fill in a questionnaire to give feedback on website usage, suggestions for improvement etc., as well as commit to providing website content and promote greater usage.
8.	Major thematic issues		
(a)	Network of sites of importance for marine turtles The Site Network was formally established through a resolution adopted at IOSEA SS6, and criteria have been agreed to evaluate the merits of including particular sites in the Network. The Advisory Committee will have used the Evaluation Criteria to assess a number of site nomination proposals formally submitted by Signatory States; and it will report its recommendations to the plenary. The agenda item also provides for discussion of next steps in the development of the Site Network. (b)	Further development of the IOSEA Technical support / Capacity-building Programme Initiatives undertaken within the framework of the existing programme will be briefly presented. 	The Sixth Meeting identified five main priority areas for IOSEA to address, concerning: (1) capacity-building (covered in Agenda item 8b); (2) socio-economic considerations; (3) genetic stocks; (4) illegal direct take; and (5) incidental capture. Each of these areas is the subject of a paper developed by either the Secretariat or an Advisory Committee member and other partners.
