## **IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROGRAMME OF WORK 2020-2023**

(Prepared by the Secretariat)

Summary:

The present document provides the status of implementation of the Programme of Work (POW) for 2020-2023, as at October 2023, following its adoption by the Conference of the Parties at its 13th meeting (COP13, 2020).

The progress report is presented in tabular form in the Annex.

## IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROGRAMME OF WORK 2020-2023

## Background

- 1. The Programme of Work (POW) for 2020-2023, as adopted by the Conference of the Parties at its 13th meeting (COP13, 2020), contains all mandates falling under the responsibility of the Secretariat as well as those that fall under the Standing Committee, the Scientific Council and their Working Groups that require the Secretariat's support.
- 2. These mandates comprise provisions of Resolutions and Decisions that were adopted by COP13 and earlier ones still in force; Action Plans; Programmes of Work; Initiatives; Concerted Actions as well as existing instruments under CMS, being the Gorilla Agreement, all CMS Memoranda of Understanding (MOUs) including those serviced by dedicated personnel, such as those on Dugongs, Birds of Prey, Sharks and marine turtles of the Indian Ocean and South-east Asia and.
- 3. The POW covers only programmatic activities for which voluntary funding is required, and does not reflect the core operational activities of the Secretariat nor the costs associated with them.
- 4. The detailed list of activities is grouped into the following areas:
  - Overarching issues;
  - Implementation Support (Scientific Advisory Services and Aquatic, Avian Species and Terrestrial Species);
  - Resource Mobilization and Interagency Affairs;
  - Information, Communication and Outreach;
  - Capacity-building;
  - Servicing of Governing Bodies.

## Implementation of the POW

- 5. The current POW has proven to be an important tool guiding the work of the Secretariat and its fundraising efforts.
- 6. Yearly priorities of the POW 2020-2023 were communicated to all CMS Parties in early and late 2021 through <u>Notification 2021/002</u> and <u>Notification 2021/013</u> respectively, as well as through <u>Notification 2022/025</u> in December 2022 and <u>Notification 2023/010</u> in March 2023 together with calls for voluntary contributions. These general appeals were coupled with tailored requests to individual Parties. The Secretariat received resources which enabled the implementation of a number of priority actions although many activities were left unfunded. Further details are provided in document <u>UNEP/CMS/COP14/Doc.13.3 Resource mobilization</u>.
- 7. Reports on progress were prepared for the consideration of the Standing Committee at its 52nd meeting (21-29 September 2021, online) through UNEP/CMS/StC52/Doc.15 and 53rd meeting (19-20 October 2022, Bonn, Germany) through UNEP/CMS/StC53/Doc.15. These reports consisted of two sections, these being (i) a narrative report on achievements, challenges the Secretariat faced and planned steps to carry out each activity and (ii) the POW in tabular form with a brief overview through a traffic-light rating system.

- 8. The current document presents only the POW in tabular form in Annex 1 as comprehensive narratives have been included in the documents prepared under related COP-agenda items. Annex 1 provides a synopsis of the status of implementation of the POW through a traffic-light rating system for 2020 2023.
- 9. For each activity, the financial resources obtained are indicated as funds provided through the CMS core budget 2020-2023 and/or through voluntary contributions with their sources. Where no funding is indicated (blanks), the activity could be carried out by staff at the Secretariat without additional voluntary resources or with in-kind support by partners.
- 10. The financial support generated (through core budget resources and voluntary contributions) for the implementation of the POW amounts to over €15 million representing 46 per cent of the total required for the POW. Despite the significant financial gap, the funding raised is not fully indicative of the overall implementation of the POW as many activities have been completed and/or have been progressed with fewer resources than estimated and with the Secretariat's in-house capacity. To this end, for these activities, no budget gap is indicated. A more truthful evaluation of the implementation of the POW could be based on results of the traffic light system assessment which indicates that out of the 131 items listed in the POW, most of them (64) have been completed while a large number of them (44) has progressed significantly and unfortunately a limited number (23) could not be implemented due to lack of financial and/or human resources.
- 11. These gaps in implementation have been reflected in the draft POW for the intersessional period 2024-2026, which is contained in Annex 6 of <u>COP14/Doc.13.2</u> <u>Budget 2024-2026 and programme of work for the intersessional period between</u> <u>COP14 and COP15</u> in line with the proposed new mandates for consideration by COP14.

## Recommended Actions

12. The Conference of the Parties is recommended to take note of the document and make any comment, as appropriate.
