Summary:

This document presents an overview of the Flyways Working Group and the three Thematic Sub-group members.

REVIEW OF THE FLYWAYS WORKING GROUP AND THE THEMATIC SUB-GROUPS MEMBERSHIP

Background

1. The Flyways Working Group (FWG) was established under [Resolution 9.2](#)¹ to address migratory bird conservation challenges. Its activities are structured around mandates set for specific periods.
2. The FWG serves as a think tank on flyways and frameworks within the CMS Scientific Council, tasked with reviewing scientific and technical issues related to the conservation of migratory birds and their habitats, as well as assessing relevant international instruments, initiatives, and processes to inform future CMS policy on flyways.
3. Successive Conference of the Parties (COPs) have expanded and reinforced its role:
 - COP10-COP11: Resolution 10.10 (COP10) [Guidance on Global Flyway Conservation and Options For Policy Arrangements](#) commended the FWG's efforts over the last triennium, called for its continuation to COP11, and urged Parties to provide resources for this work.
 - COP11-COP12: Resolution 11.14 (COP11) [Programme of Work on Migratory Birds and Flyways](#) extended the FWG's mandate to COP12 and outlined activities to be undertaken.
 - COP12-COP13: Resolution 12.11 [Flyways](#) consolidated earlier resolutions, providing a comprehensive roadmap for action during intersessional periods. The associated POW (see; [Annex I of the Resolution](#)) formed the basis for activities undertaken.
 - COP13-COP14: Resolution 12.11 (Rev.COP12) [Flyways](#) extended the FWG's mandate to COP14.
 - COP14-COP15: Resolution 12.11 (Rev.COP14) [Flyways](#) outlines the current FWG mandate, emphasizing collaboration, innovation, and targeted conservation efforts.
4. To address priority conservation areas, the FWG established thematic sub-groups:
 - April 2024 ([Third FWG Meeting](#), online): Seabirds; Review of the Global Programme of Work (POW); Collaboration with Other Instruments; Platforms and Hubs; and Gaps and Priorities.
 - September 2024 (Informal discussion of FWG members in the margins of the seventh meeting of the Sessional Committee of the Scientific Council): Task teams were reorganized into three sub-groups: New Programme of Work (POW), Gaps, and Priorities; Seabirds; and Other Instruments and Platforms/Hubs.
5. The FWG's membership comprises experts on CMS-listed migratory bird species, individuals knowledgeable about and active in flyways, species, and habitat conservation, CMS Scientific Councillor's and observer organizations of the Council, and other key organizations and invited experts to enhance the group's efforts.

6. COP14 adopted action-oriented Decisions (see [Decisions of the Conference of the Parties to CMS in effect after its 14th Meeting | CMS](#)) which read as follows

14.142 Directed to the Secretariat

The Secretariat shall, subject to the availability of external resources:

- a) organize sub-regional meetings aimed at sharing best practices and lessons learned on flyway-scale conservation, awareness-raising, and on the development of adequate institutional frameworks to protect them;*
- b) support the work of the Flyways Working Group, in particular by organizing its meetings, aiding the development of a monitoring tool to provide Parties with an objective, fact-based national self assessment of the current status of flyways at national level, and helping to raise awareness of flyways conservation;and*

Activities to implement Decision 14.142 regarding review of the Flyways Working Group and the three Thematic Sub-group membership

7. The Secretariat has reviewed the current membership of the Flyways Working Group and the three thematic Sub-Groups as of January 2025.

Review of Flyways Working Group Membership

8. **Country Membership:** Consists of 10 members, distributed across regions as follows:
 - i. America, North : 1
 - ii. America, Central : 4
 - iii. Asia : 1
 - iv. Europe : 1
 - v. Oceania : 3
