- 26 key actions emerged from TAG 1, and were developed...

- Activity 3. Threats

- Activity 5. Common standards for methods/data sharing
- Activities 6 & 7. Reporting and horizon scanning
 Now some detail....

Species lists

- Proposed taxonomic amendments...
 considered 76 species under Annex 1 of
 the MoU => over 20 changes... removals,
 additions, amendments largely due to
 taxonomic verification to conform with del
 Hoyo and Collar (2014):
 - 3 species removed: Milvus lineatus, Buteo oreophilus, Falco pelegrinoides
 - 2 species added: Buteo japonicus, B.
 trizonatus

More species ...

- Major review of migration, movements and occurrences, mindful of proposed species changes
- Propose addition of maximum of 20 species (inc. 12 vultures) to Annex 1; of these, 18 recommended by TAG (too little current evidence for *Polyboroides typus*, Falco jugger)
- Major work by TAG experience and judgements – lot of detail presented

Addition of vultures

- + Upsurge in use of radio telemetry and satellite tracking (esp. African vultures)
- + Age and seasonal differences
- Variations in food distribution critical
- + Exceptional concerns over conservation status of Asian vultures
- Raptor MoU offers major framework for supporting recovery of vultures

Recap

- TAG overhauled species listings
- Provided proposals for Raptor MoU Annex
 1 and Annex 3
- Vultures have growing prominence

Sites

- Major TAG effort in revising the Table 3 sites list – given number of Range States, this has been a massive undertaking: over 7,000 new sites proposed
- Further work on Table 3, beyond MOS2 subject to views on species and sites – possibly avoid reference to e.g. SPAs, IBAs
- Need to report on status of sites six yearly?
- Need evidence-based and suitably timed consultation on changes – needs to begin soon!

Threats

- Developments in advice on managing sites/flyways
- IUCN Guidelines continue to work well
- Powergrids/lines/developments subject to guidelines and guidance. Need to link with CMS Energy Task Force. Importance of 'Power Africa' noted
- Progress on 'Illegal killing and taking' guidance
- Noted significant developments through satellite tracking

Threats cont.

- Need to mobilize more public support
- Major opportunities for devising 'Friends' of the Raptors MoU'
- Saker Falcon Task Force was a major breakthrough, and especially in addressing conflicts
- Diclofenac toxic to vulture and some other scavengers, still licensed for sale for veterinary use in parts of EU

Common standards

 Growing number of examples of good practice at national/state levels regarding surveys, monitoring and use of technologies – opportunities to commission a review

Awareness raising

- Major opportunities satellite tracking studies and other research insights
- Plight of vultures possibly 'Year of Vultures'... we have hit a 'perfect storm' for this group of birds
