



Many challenges!

- Scope of the Initiative
- Gaps
- Geographical representivity
- General apathy and lack of knowledge
- Buy-in from key decision-makers and organisations
- Governmental and broader political support





Potential added value of African-Eurasian Vulture Multi-species Action Plan

- Agree priorities and course of action among wide range of stakeholders
- Agree division of labour among stakeholders
- Ensure sharing of knowledge/experience between regions and species
- Collaborative efforts between regions and species (eg diclofenac)
- Raise up political agenda
- Raise public awareness
- Attract donors (mega-bids)

Recommendations following the Vulture side-event – 6.10.2015

- Confirmed the need for a multi-species action plan (MSAP)
- 2. ToR of TAG should include a task outlining the above
- 3. Include a site-based approach which identifies key vulture areas across the flyway and promotes appropriate conservation interventions to the benefit of vultures in these areas
- 4. Identify and appoint 3 regional coordinators to take the work of the MSAP forward under the guidance of
 - a Chairperson with Vice-chairs



The Way Forward

- MoS2 tasked the TAG with facilitating the development of an African-Eurasian Vulture Multi-species Action Plan for adoption at CMS COP12 in 2017 and MoS3 in 2018
- Establish a CMS Vulture Task Force to draft and oversee the implementation of the Vulture MSAP
- Partnership between CMS (Raptors MoU, Preventing Poisoning WG, Energy Task Force), BirdLife International and IUCN SSC Vulture Specialist Group
