

BirdLife Central Asian Flyway Initiative (CAFI)

Strengthening migratory bird conservation

- 1. Launched in 2020 at CMS COP13
- 2. Uniting 10 BirdLife Partners across CAF
- 3. Strong network to deliver conservation action
- 4. ??Expecting strong outcomes for the CAF in COP14??





BirdLife in the Central Asian Flyway

Progress made

- 1. CAF Situation analysis Review of present and emerging threats to migratory birds, basis for priority setting & planning consultation draft in circulation
- 2. Conservation action. Support international & national species action.
 Example 1: Steppe Eagle Kazakhstan. ACBK: Monitoring, Satellite tags & Safe Energy Initiative
 - **Example 2**: Black-necked Crane in Bhutan. RSPN, Managing wintering sites, Monitoring & Development Action Plan
- 3. Conservation capacity Strengthen organisations to take action
 BirdLife Partners supporting development of a strong CAF institutional framework, increasing communication across CAF




To CMS COP14 and beyond
