









Criteria & Standards to for determine the list of wild species that are banned for hunting

- 1) The species that are forbidden to be hunted directly or indirectly by Islamic law (Sharia Law).
- 2) Documented scientific studies and research outcomes.
- 3) International regulations under international and regional agreements ratified/ singed by the Kingdom's government.
- 4) The existence of a ban or a prevention of hunting of migratory birds by the Ministry of Environment, Water and Agriculture.

Implement Criteria to determine the number of hunting bags of each species in one season
