# I. How to get to Parma

The workshop will be hosted in Parma, a city in the northern Italian region of Emilia-Romagna famous for its prosciutto (ham), cheese, architecture, music and surrounding countryside. It is home to the University of Parma, one of the oldest universities in the world. There are four suitable airports, Milano Malpensa, Milano Linate, Bergamo and Bologna. There are good train connections within Italy, from all four airports as well as from La Spezia, that will take you to the train station in Parma, shown on the map below.

## Milan Malpensa Airport (MXP)

Malpensa Airport is the largest international airport in the Milan metropolitan area in northern Italy. It serves 15 million inhabitants in Lombardy, Piedmont and Liguria, as well as those living in the Swiss region of Canton Ticino.

The Malpensa Express trains run from Terminal 2 and Terminal 1 stations, and goes to Milan Central station, connecting there to trains to Parma. A train leaves every 30 minutes in each direction (or hourly during early mornings or late evenings). Journey times are 46 minutes (semi-fast) and 53 minutes (stopping).

# Milan Linate Airport (LIN)

Linate Airport is the second largest international airport of Milan located only 7 km east of the city centre. To reach the Central Station of Milan (Milano Centrale) you will need to take a coach:

# Orio al Serio (Bergamo) International Airport (BGY)

Orio al Serio International Airport, officially also known as II Caravaggio International Airport, is the third busiest international airport in Italy. It is located in the municipal territory of Orio al Serio, 3.7 kilometres southeast of Bergamo in Italy. The airport is called Milan/Bergamo by several airlines, although neither "Milan" nor "Bergamo" are part of the airport's official naming. There are several public transportation links to and from downtown Milan, including express coaches. You can arrive by train to Bergamo train station and use the convenient bus service ATB which in just 10 minutes will bring you to Milan Bergamo airport. #### **Bologna Airport (BLQ)**

Bologna Guglielmo Marconi Airport is approximately 6 km (3.7 mi) northwest of the city centre in the Emilia-Romagna region of Italy. The Airport is about 6 kilometres from Bologna Centrale railway station, one of the most important railway stations in Italy. When you arrive at the airport, you can reach the Station by Aerobus – BLQ shuttle service (Travel time: about 20 minutes), or by Taxi. You will then take a train to Parma. No on-board ticketing on the train is possible, ticket machines are inside the airport in front of the BLQ shuttle stop. For the train timetables Bologna/Parma visit the site www.trenitalia.com

## Parma Public transport system

The Central Station is the hub for Parma's excellent public transportation system. Please note that all tickets for train and bus travel must be purchased before boarding as cash is not accepted on buses or trains. Staff at the Central Station transport office can advise you on the best option for travel and purchasing tickets based on your destination. #### Reaching the meeting venue from Parma train station

The walk to the venue from the train station/hotel is about 7 minutes. Exit from the lowest floor of the station and head north on Viale Paolo Borsellino toward Via Monte Corno. Turn right onto Strada Alessandria. Turn left onto Via Trento. Turn right onto Via Pasubio. Destination will be on the right.

#### **Taxis**

The Central Station is the closest train stop, and main bus stop, to our venue. There is a taxi stand outside Central Station in Viale Giovanni Falcone if needed.


The meeting will take place at the Lipu national headquarter in the north area of Parma City.

#### X. Weather

The climate in Parma during April can be summarized as mild and reasonably dry, with an average temperature between 14-16°C.

However, do not forget to bring your raincoat, umbrella and a pullover since weather in April is at best unpredictable and it can be chilly.

#### XI. Currency

Italy's currency is the Euro (€). As of 23.03.2023, the exchange rate was € 0.92 for 1 USD. Credit cards are accepted in hotels and in most restaurants in Parma.

# XII. Voltage and Type of Pins

In Italy the power sockets are of type F and L. The standard voltage is 230 V and the standard frequency is 50 Hz. Please remember to bring your own converter.

- Type F: also known as "Schuko". This socket also works with plug C and plug E.
- Type L: This type is of Italian origin. This socket also works with plug C.





#### XIII. Working language of the meeting

The meeting will be conducted in English. During the open session on Tuesday afternoon, interpretation to Italian will be provided.

#### XIV. Internet

WiFi will be provided free of charge in the meeting room and for the duration of the meeting.
