- UPDATE AND REVISE 6 action plans for birds with continuous population declines and/or those in need of coordinated conservation efforts at international level;
- Develop NEW action plans for two species of threatened birds, in accordance with the latest IUCN Red List assessment;
- Respond to an EXPRESSED NEED BY THE EUROPEAN COMMISSION to develop and test/apply a methodology for multi-species action plans for a group of species, based on commonalities in their habitat needs;
- Put in place a SYSTEM FOR COORDINATION among the main actors involved in the development and implementation of species action plans. The system will lead to improved information flow, transparency and effectiveness of consultations







Landing page → Continue as guest



Home page → click on your species and then click on "Go to timeline"




Timeline page → click on "Expand all" to see the different events and documents.




After expanding, you will see the dates and description of the events: **Status report, workshop, draft action plan** and **species action plan**.

Click on the "book icon" to visualize and/or download the documents in PDF. The legend shows if the action is "done", "ongoing" or "upcoming".




Implementation phase: after the **adoption of the plan**, the reporting on the implementation of the conservation actions will be done every **x** years, as stablished in the SAP. **National focal points** will be appointed for each plan and they will report in SAP TT the level of implementation of the priority conservation actions.




The results of the report will be visualized in two ways:


a) **See results by action:** the drop down menu shows the priority conservation actions defined in the SAP and the colours show the progress achieved: **no progress, some progress, significant progress** and **completed.**




b) See implementation scores by country






a) "Contributors" will show you the name of the Species Coordinator and the name of the people that are contributing to the development of the action plan.




b) "Contact coordinator": general users can use this option to share data, ask questions to the Species Coordinator, etc.




c) "About the species": provides a link to the species profile and to the IBA list in Datazone.






Resources: you will find four different sections.



Key documents: this section is the repository where you can find the previous action plan (if existing), the status report, the draft action plan and the species action plan.




Data sources: list of websites, platforms and tools.




Action Plan Templates → not available yet, but at the moment there are 2-3 potential templates to be used (BirdLife, AEWA, EC)


